


EBL, Ebrary and EBSCO eBook FAQ's

Introduction

All the ebook collections allow you to read ebooks online using a web browser. This requires that you access the books through the library website, and, if you are off campus, login to the campus VPN (Pulse Secure)  before accessing an ebook. A couple of vendors, Ebrary and EBL, also offer downloadable readers with some additional features.

UC Davis has selected ebooks from three vendors or aggregators. Unfortunately, every ebook collection or vendor has a different license agreement and may be different in terms of downloading, copying, or printing content. Some ebook collections will allow books to be downloaded to your computer or reader for a certain amount of time. Downloading to a computer or mobile device for offline reading, when available, may require additional software or a mobile app. However, many of the ebook collections that the library subscribes to do not allow downloading of their content for offline use. Some also restrict the number of pages or amount of text that can be copied or printed from ebooks.

The table below provides an overview of the key things you need to know about using the **Ebrary, EBL and EBSCO** ebook collections.

Since they use **DRM (digital rights management)** software, there are limits for borrowing, printing, saving and copying.

Downloading to a computer or mobile device for offline reading--when available--will require additional software or a mobile app.

EBL, ebrary, and Ebsco eBooks are in PDF and/or epub format. They can be read online through most web browsers, although the EBL books will prompt a user to login and read using the Adobe Digital Editions application after 5 or 10 minutes "browsing" time.
