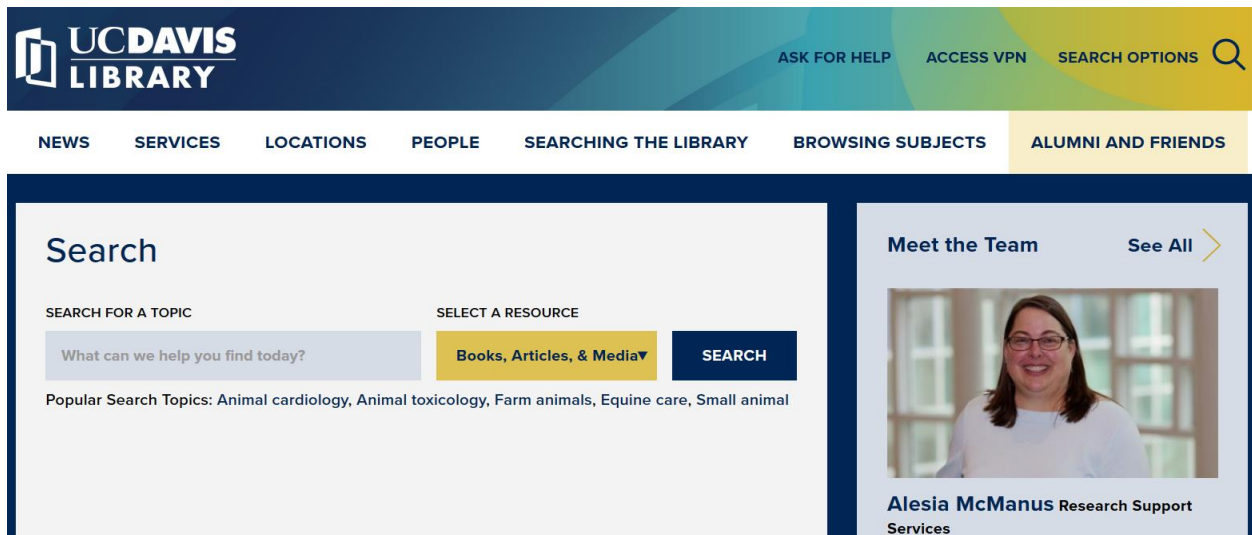


UCD VPN Instructions for Windows 7, 8 or 10

Open your favorite browser and navigate to lib.ucdavis.edu. Click the "Access VPN" link in the upper right corner.



Scroll down to the VPN client section of the resulting page. Click "Windows32 bit" or "Windows 64bit" depending on your operating system. Run the .exe file that the browser downloads.

This window should appear. Follow the instructions to download Pulse Secure.



NOTE It should prompt you here if you are downloading the wrong bit version.

Once downloaded, click the arrow on the bottom right part (notifications) of your screen and right click Pulse Secure icon.



Then click “Open Pulse Secure”.

When the Pulse Secure windows appears, Click the + button to create a connection profile.

Leave the Type as "Policy Secure (UAC) or Connect Secure (VPN)"
Enter a name for Name, i.e. "SA" or "Library VPN" (can be anything)

For Server enter "vpn.library.ucdavis.edu"

Click Add



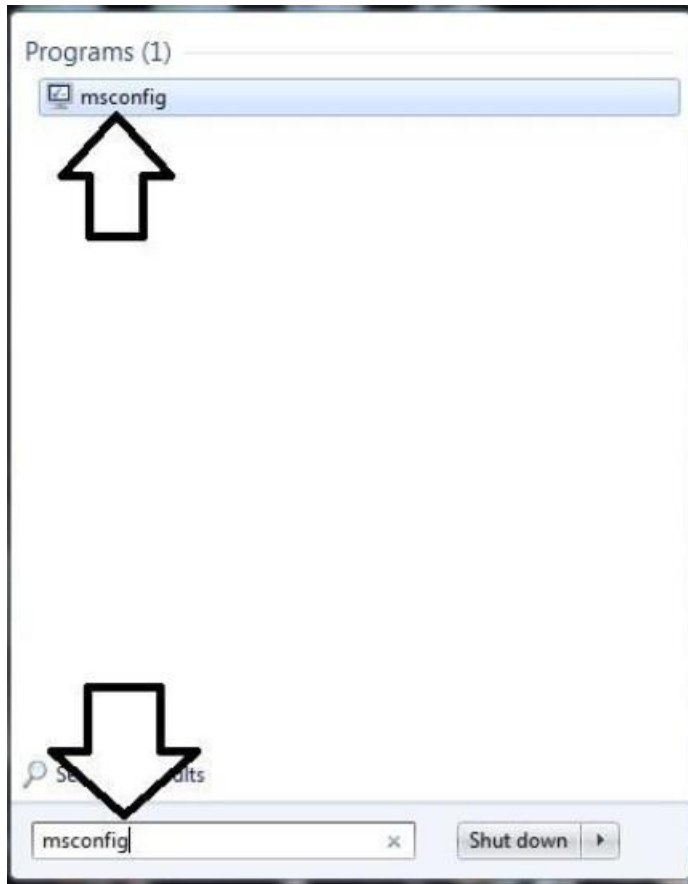
Then click "Connect." You may also check "Save settings" in order for this window to never appear again when logging in.

Enter your Kerberos or CAS login. If you wish to save your login information, make sure to check "Save settings".

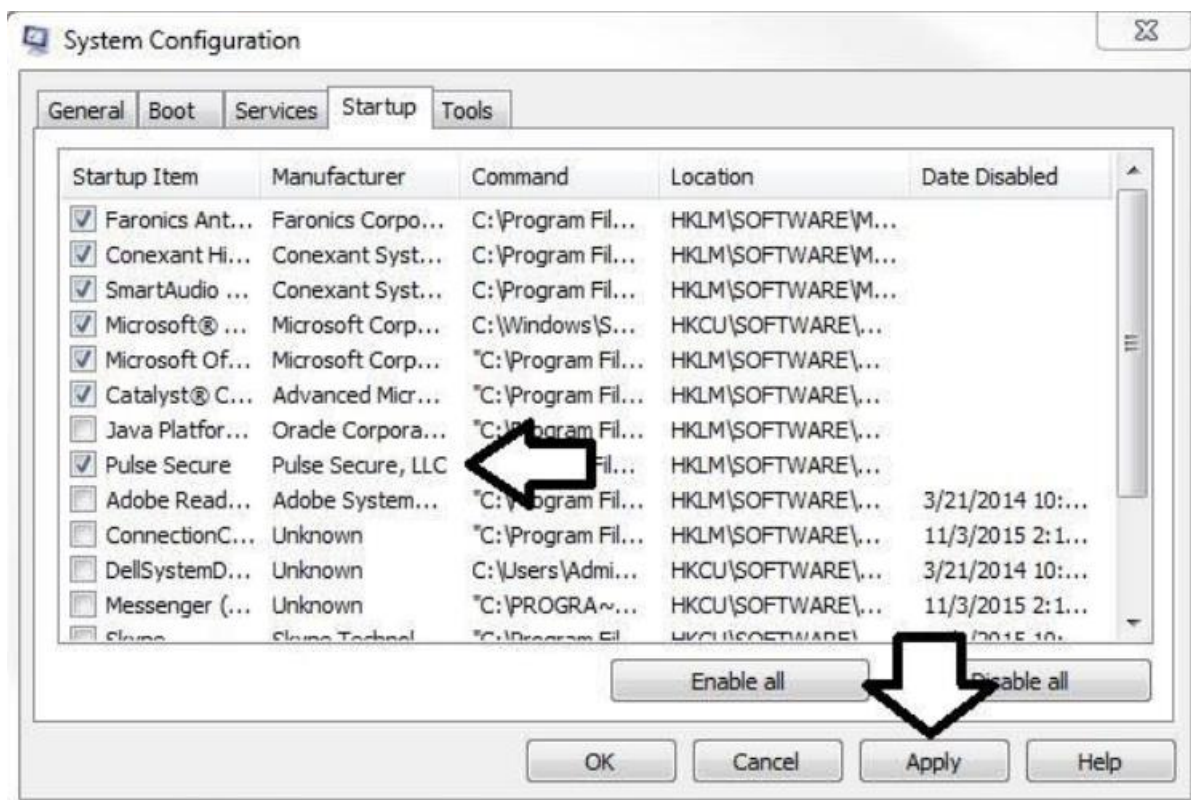


If successful, the Pulse Secure page should look like this. Congrats! You are now logged into the LibraryVPN.

FOR ADVANCED USERS, scroll down to see how to remove Pulse Secure from automatically starting when logging on.



Copy and paste msconfig into your Windows search bar, and click on the program that shows up.



Navigate to the “Startup” tab and uncheck the “Pulse Secure” program. Then click “apply” and then “OK”. A restart may be required after closing the System Configuration window.
